CURE calls for Senators to oppose \$3.5 trillion budget resolution

Washington, D.C. – With U.S. Senators currently deliberating a budget resolution that would pave the way for a massive \$3.5 trillion spending bill and destroy the U.S. economy, the Center for Urban Renewal and Education (CURE) weighed in on Tuesday, highlighting a few of the many issues in this legislation that would dramatically expand the size of government while weakening the economy and individual freedoms.

The letter, signed by CURE President Star Parker, Director of Governmental Relations Marty Dannenfels, and Director of CURE's Clergy Center Reverend Tim Latiff, warns that through this budget resolution, they're "proposing to bring back the failed welfare policies of the 1990's that then-Senator Biden and other Senators opposed."

Regarding healthcare, the letter mentions the proposal would expand Medicare by a massive \$300 billion. Stating that this will be "another giant stride toward single-payer health care," the letter raises that "millions of Americans lost their health-insurance plans and the doctor of their choice the last time liberals made that type of investment."

The budget resolution would also "transform the child tax credit into a government child allowance that gives cash to parents who aren't working." Furthermore, regarding the proposals directed towards climate concerns, the letter warns they will destroy America's domestic fossil fuel industry.

"Not only would this eliminate good American jobs, it would make America more reliant on hostile nations for our energy needs. This would cause a major rise in gas and electricity prices for those who can least afford it – low-income Americans," reads the letter.

CURE urges Senators to oppose this budget resolution as a "massive political power grab" giving government control over how we live our lives and how we raise our children. Instead of expanding the role of government, Senators should work towards reducing it, and instead expand individual freedom and personal responsibility for all Americans.
