Dear Senator,

In the coming days, the Senate will consider a budget resolution to facilitate a \$3.5 trillion spending bill that would restructure the U.S. economy into a government-controlled welfare state that inserts itself into every single aspect of Americans' daily lives.

The Biden Administration and liberals in Congress are seeking to transform the way we raise our children. We have seen their desire to rewrite history by indoctrinating our children through critical race theory curriculum and by pitting one group against another based on the color of their skin. Now we see their economic mode to enact that agenda.
